- Question was asked about the age range that is affected. Officer Haugen says the largest part of the population that he deals with is 25 or older.
- How are referrals made? Right now, it is word of mouth and passing out business cards. You can also call human services and ask to speak to someone in the outreach team.
- How is time split between different sides of Island county? The plan is to have two days in Island County and two days in Oak Harbor, but primarily they go where the need is for the day and respond accordingly.
